

Bradford On Avon Sailing Club Covid 19 Rules

Amended in Red for Race Sailing dated 22nd July 2020

The Club House and Boat Park

- Always remain 2m apart.
- Please park allowing a 2m gap between vehicles.
- The club will be open from **about 1pm till 5:30pm for Race Sailing (and social sailing for those unwilling to race)**. The OOD will be on hand during these times to assist and man the rescue boat.
- The club house will remain closed apart from the toilets.
- No refreshments will be served (please bring your own)
- No Changing in the club house. Please change before arriving at the club or discreetly by your car.
- If using the toilets "Observe a 1-in only rule' unless from the same household.
- When using the toilets please:
 - Wash your hands after use with the hand wash provided.
 - Use the handtowels provided. Please screw up tightly and place in bins.
 - Once finished wipe all surfaces that you have touched with the surface cleaner and handtowels provided. Once again please dispose in the bin provided.

Using Club Boats

- As usual all club boats are available for use.
- Crewed boats must only be used by members of the same household.
- One person only to use each boat each day. A 72-hour period is required before the same boat can be used again by a different individual.
- Club life jackets are available but must only be used by one person each day and left to one side in the large bucket marked 'used life jackets'. A 72-hour period is required before the life jacket can be used again.
- Please return all equipment to the location where it was found.

Rescue Boat

- The rescue boat will be on the water between **1:30pm and the end of the 2nd Race**.
- This may be operated by a single person.
- The rescue boat must be launched, operated, and recovered by the same individuals only, maintaining the 2m distance rule.
- Please ensure your painter is adequate length to enable towing without breaching the 2m rule (ideally 4m long).
- A separate set of control measures are in place for the rescue boat.

On the Water

- To comply with government guidelines **no more than 6 people may be in the setting-up, launch and recovery area at any one time**. Start times may be staggered by the OOD to aid this as necessary. You are asked to move yourself & boat away from the slipway & launch area as soon as possible to help the OOD.
- Launching trolleys should only be handled by the same person.
- Crewed boats can only be sailed by individuals from the same household.
- One boat to use the slip way at a time.
- There may be limited rescue boat cover at times. Please be prepared to self-rescue. To assist you may consider:
 - Carrying a paddle
 - Fit a flotation device to the top of the mast.
 - Consider the wind conditions and whether they are suitable to your experience.
- Life Jackets to be worn at all times.
